Semester and Academic Year Programs

The semester at Spanish Studies Abroad in Seville begins with a three-week intensive period, with students enrolling in a 3-credit language class and a 1-credit language module. Students are also encouraged to enroll in SPAN 343 Cultural Realities of Spain. Following the intensive period, students continue their semester with a full course schedule, enrolling in an additional two to four courses, as well as a second language module. Students must preregister for a minimum of 12 and a maximum of 18 credits over the intensive and semester periods.

After consulting with your advisor, please choose courses following the guidelines below:

1. The prerequisite for this program is the successful completion of one semester of intermediate college Spanish or the equivalent. Minimum 3.0 in Spanish course work. Consult the Spanish Studies Abroad website or Brochure for prerequisites to individual courses.
2. You must enroll in a minimum of 12 credits and a maximum of 18 credits for each semester. Advanced students may take additional credits with prior approval from their advisor and the Resident Director.
3. You must select a language class for the Intensive Period. Most students will enroll in SPAN 305A for three credits during the Intensive Period, while some will choose SPAN 204, SPAN 306A, or SPAN 307A. You may indicate that you wish to be considered for SPAN 403, but must also select an alternate course, as registration for SPAN 403 is finalized after the placement test at the start of the program in Seville.
4. It is mandatory for all students to enroll in two 1- credit language modules per semester, one in the Intensive Period and one in the Continuation Period. Students enrolling in SPAN 204 during the Intensive Period must select SPAN 205 as their language module for the Intensive Period. Students enrolling in SPAN 305A during the Intensive Period must select SPAN 310E as their language module for the Intensive Period. **Heritage and/or native speakers are not allowed to enroll in the Listening (310L) or Speaking (310SP) modules.**
5. Students are encouraged to enroll in SPAN 343 in their first semester at Spanish Studies Abroad. This course will run throughout the entire semester.
6. During the Continuation Period, students enrolled in SPAN 204 for the Intensive Period are required to enroll in SPAN 305B, Advanced Spanish Expression & Grammar II.
7. The following Continuation Period content courses are recommended for students who enroll in SPAN 204 in the Intensive Period: SPAN 303/304, SPAN 317/318, SPAN 353/354, SOCI 351, and SPAN 362, and Spanish Studies Abroad recommends selecting 1-2 of these courses.
8. If you select a 400-level course, you must have prior experience in a pertinent field of study; see descriptions and prerequisites in the Spanish Studies Abroad website or Brochure.
9. The minimum enrollment for a course is five students.
10. Experiential Learning opportunities have a prerequisite of one course in advanced college Spanish prior to the program and are approved in Seville. On this preregistration form you may indicate that you wish to enroll in an Experiential Learning opportunity, but must select a full course load from non-Experiential Learning courses during the Continuation Period, in the event that your selection is not approved.
11. Please note that there are additional fees for LTC courses. Contact Spanish Studies Abroad for details.
